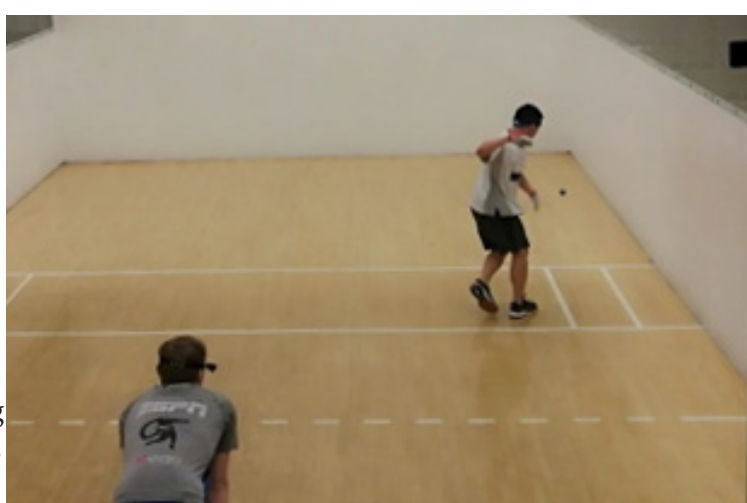




Get to know more about Steven Woo!
